## 2016 U.S. ETHANOL EXPORTS

U.S. Ethanol Exports, 2006-2016

In 2016, the U.S. exported 1.05 billion gallons of ethanol-the second-highest annual total on record. In 2016, American-made ethanol was exported to more than 50 countries on all six inhabited continents around the world.

2016 Monthly Ethanol Exports, by Type

Undenatured ethanol for fuel use accounted for 51\% of total exports in 2016, overtaking denatured fuel ethanol as the leading ethanol export product for the first time ever. Meanwhile, denatured ethanol for fuel use made up $43 \%$. Denatured and undenatured ethanol for industrial uses totaled 5\%.


## 2016 U.S. ETHANOL EXPORTS

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Export Share of U.S. Ethanol Production

An estimated 6.9\% of total U.S. ethanol production was exported in 2016, the second-highest share in history and highest in five years.


Value of U.S. Ethanol Exports

U.S. ethanol exports were valued at $\$ 2.02$ billion in 2016, up 13\% from 2015 and the thirdhighest on record.

## U.S. ETHANOL EXPORTS: SHIFTING MARKETS

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Exports to South America and East Asia boomed in 2016, growing $118 \%$ and $69 \%$, respectively, over 2015 levels. Meanwhile, exports to Southeast Asia, the Middle East, and North Africa slumped. After importing 174 million gallons in 2012, the EU-28 brought in just 10 million gallons in 2016.

2015-2016 Monthly U.S. Ethanol Exports to China

U.S. ethanol exports to China remained highly volatile in 2016. China imported 110 million gallons in the first four months of the year, dropped out of the market in June and July, returned in the fall, then exited again in December.

## 2016 U.S. ETHANOL IMPORTS

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U.S. Fuel Ethanol Imports, 2006-2016


In 2016, the U.S. imported just 34 million gallons of fuel ethanol, down 64\% from 2015 and the lowest annual total in six years. U.S. ethanol imports have averaged just 70 million gallons annually over the past three years.

Undenatured ethanol for fuel use accounted for more than $99 \%$ of total imports in 2016, while denatured ethanol for fuel use made up less than $1 \%$. More than $99 \%$ of 2016 imports were received in the May-August period.

Brazil saw its shipments to the U.S. fall by $63 \%$ in 2016, but it remained as the leading source of U.S. fuel ethanol imports. Guatemala was the only other supplier to register meaningful volumes in 2016. Top suppliers of U.S. fuel ethanol imports are shown in the table at left, along with a comparison to 2015 volumes.

## Top Ports of Entry for 2016 U.S. Ethanol Imports

California ports received $99.7 \%$ of U.S. fuel ethanol imports in 2016, compared to just $38 \%$ in 2015. The share of imports received through the port of New York fell from 13\% in 2015 to less than $1 \%$ in 2016. Historical import hubs like Miami, Tampa, and Houston recorded no fuel ethanol imports in 2016.

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## U.S. Ethanol Export Data

- The export data in this report includes exports classified under the following Harmonized Tariff Schedule (HTS) codes:
- 2207200010: Ethyl alcohol and other spirits, denatured, of any strength: For fuel use
- 2207106010: Undenatured ethyl alcohol of an alcoholic strength by volume of 80 percent vol. or higher: For non-beverage purposes: For fuel use
- 2207200090: Ethyl alcohol and other spirits, denatured, of any strength: Other
- 2207106090: Undenatured ethyl alcohol of an alcoholic strength by volume of 80 percent vol. or higher: For non-beverage purposes: Other
- 2207200090 and 2207106090 are included in this report because there is some anecdotal evidence that exports of ethanol intended for fuel use are sometimes classified under these codes. In any case, ethanol classified under these codes represented just 5\% of the 2016 U.S. exports discussed in this report.
